"Texas A&&M" appears as "Texas A&M."

The eCampus learning management system transition is off to a great start! At College Station, 69 percent of eLearning sections have been moved to eCampus. 45,472 students are using eCampus for at least one course this fall. Both Galveston and Qatar campuses are 100 percent eCampus.

To transition to eCampus, instructors and support staff can learn the basics through interactive, video-based tutorials, "Setting Up Your Course" and "Migrating from eLearning

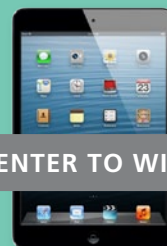

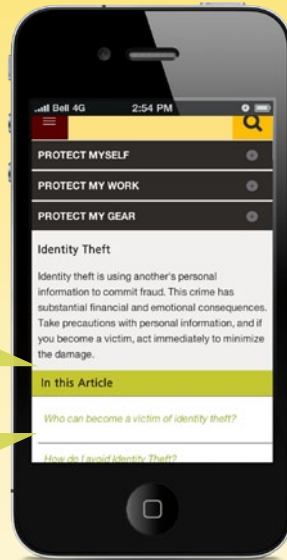
Better Network to Keep You **CONNECTED**

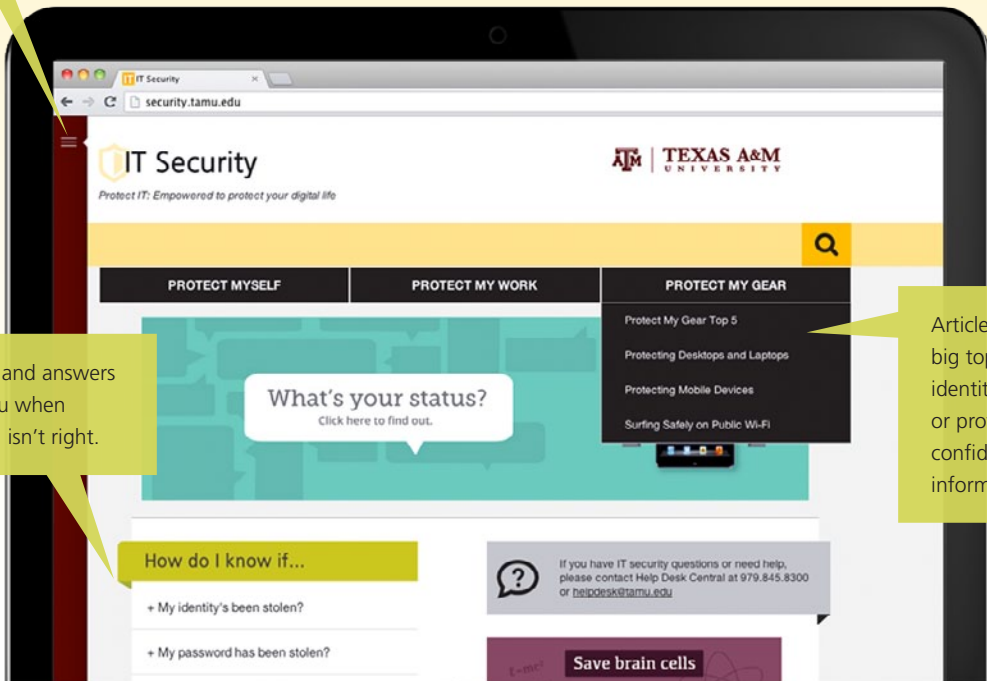
